Chili (and other soup) Cook-Off

Shake off those winter chills and join us Sunday Feb. 8, 2009 - 5 PM
St. Patrick's School Gym
Soup, sandwiches, deserts and drinks will be served. Sponsored by the Knights of Columbus

Contest Rules

1. Chili must be prepared, in advance, from raw ingredients compiled by the contestant from their own original recipe. In other words, no mixes, canned chili, or cookbook recipes.
2. The chili meat must be beef, pork, or chicken, no wild game or exotic meats.
3. The chili may be made with or without beans.
4. A complete list of ingredients must be available for each entry.
5. Contestants must be willing to eat their own chili.
6. Each contestant must cook a minimum of four to six (4 - 6) quarts of chili for the competition. Keep in mind that the more people who taste the chili, the more votes you may receive for the peoples choice award.
7. All contestants must provide their own serving utensils and heating apparatus; crock-pots are preferred.
8. Contestants are responsible for the maintenance of their entry to ensure it's proper temperature for serving.
9. KofC will provide the cups, and spoons for sampling.
10. Each Contestant will receive an entry number for their entry that must be posted on or next to the chili container.
11. All decisions of the Judges are final.
12. Judging will be based on the number of votes received from the public for the Peoples Choice Chili award.
13. Judging will be based on appearance, texture, and taste for the Best Chili, Best Spicy Chili, and Best Non-Chili. A spiciness category will be used to determine spicy chili. Judges will rate the chili from 1-10 in each category. The highest combined scores from all the judges will determine the winner. In case of a tie in the judges voting, the most votes received in the peoples choice category will help determine the winner.
14. Other soups are welcome, but only one prize will be awarded in the other soup category for Best Non-Chili. For other soup rules just substitute the word 'soup' where you see 'chili' in the rules above.
15. \$25 Scrip prize and a trophy will be awarded to each category winner.
16. Judging will begin at 5 PM and prizes will be awarded at 7 PM on Sunday Feb. 8th.
