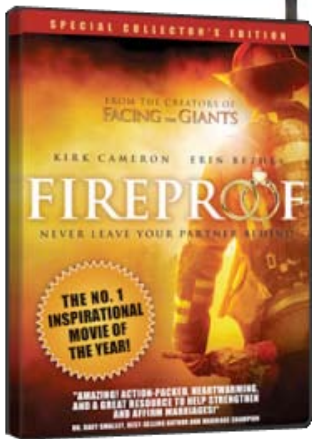
## Ten Commandments Dedication
